

Rationale

The parking of cars and other vehicles in and around the College grounds is a daily necessity, but also raises a number of safety and traffic issues that must be well managed to ensure the safety of College community members and visitors.

Aims

To ensure that car and vehicle parking in and around the College grounds is safe, orderly and in accordance with the law.

Implementation

1. Parking on College Grounds

- 1.1. The parking of any vehicle inside the College grounds is at the discretion of the principal.
- 1.2. The staff car parks are for use by staff members only, and will be clearly signposted as such.
- 1.3. Parents or visitors who park in the staff car park will be reminded of the need to park elsewhere. Habitual offenders will be issued with an official trespass warning from the principal.
- 1.4. No person other than a staff member is to drive a vehicle onto the College grounds without prior approval from the College principal.
- 1.5. When driving on College Grounds the speed limit is 10kmph.
- 1.6. All College grounds vehicle access will be secured out of College hours.
- 1.7. Damage to vehicles parked on College grounds is generally not covered by the Department of Education insurance.

2. On-Street Parking around College Precinct

- 2.1. College Council will work with the municipal council to ensure all on-street parking is clearly signposted and College Council will seek cooperation from the local municipal council in ensuring that on-street parking has appropriate zones applied.
- 2.2. College Council will encourage frequent visitations from local parking enforcement officers to ensure compliance with parking regulations.
- 2.3. Staff members will not approach members of the community who are parking inappropriately outside the College grounds.
- 2.4. Sufficient disabled car parking will be available and monitored.

3. General

- 3.1. The College will provide a staggered start and finish to the College day to encourage parents to collect students at different times.
- 3.2. The College will actively encourage sustainable transport programs.
- 3.3. The College will actively promote and encourage safe bike riding to and from the College through education programs.
- 3.4. Proper road and safe parking practices will be regular features of the College newsletter.
- 3.5. The College will continue to liaise with government agencies with respect to effective and safe traffic management in the College precinct.
