INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC ACADEMY BACKGROUND

Our Vision

The Hazel Glen College Instrumental Music Academy (**IMA**) welcomes all students, including those with no prior musical experience. The Academy is designed to introduce students to a variety of instruments and music skills, fostering their development from the ground up. Through a supportive and growth-focused approach, we help students build a foundation in music, preparing them for future pathways. Our aim is to balance academics, nurture leadership, and cultivate a love for music, empowering students to grow as individuals and global citizens.

Our Mission

- To create a welcoming environment where students can start their musical journey with no previous experience, building skills and confidence in a supportive setting
- To nurture a love for music and equip students with the foundational and advanced skills needed to pursue musical and professional opportunities
- To assist students in balancing their academic and instrumental goals, developing the mental and technical skills that enable them to achieve their full potential
- To foster leadership and personal development, empowering students to take initiative, build resilience, and grow as confident, capable individuals both within and beyond the Academy

Instrumental Music Academy

Students will participate in 3 X 60 - minute sessions per week that are a combination of timetabled, instrumental and after school classes. Student musicians will follow a high performance curriculum that will further deepen and support their musical success in and out of the classroom. The Instrumental Music Academy is a 2 year program for student musicians starting in Year 5 and Year 7, and requires a 2 year commitment.

If fees are not paid by the due date, the following steps will be taken:

- an initial reminder email will be sent to parents/guardians with a specified payment date

Stage 1 of Application: Written Application

Student Musicians must complete all sections of the *IMA Written Application* and submit a <u>hardcopy</u> to the College's **Main Office or a Digital Application** to the IMA email address <u>before 4:00pm, Wednesday 12th November 2025</u>. There will be no accepted application after the above date and time for 2026, Term 1 enrollments.

Any late applications will be placed into the rolling application cycle for consideration in Mid-Term 1 or Term 2, 2026 enrollment. Applications will be reviewed periodically, and students will be notified of their progression to Stage 2—or if they were unsuccessful—at mid-term and end-of-term intervals. Successful applicants will commence in the program at the next available intake.

Student Musicians who are successful in reaching Stage 2 of their IMA Application will be notified via email sent by ima@hazelglencollege.com. (If an email is not received by 4pm on Friday 14th November, your application has not been successful.)

Stage 2 of Application: Student Video Submission

Student Musicians who are successful in their completion of Stage 1 of their IMA Application will be notified via email as listed above. A maximum of 25 Student Musicians for each Year Level will be successful in reaching Stage 2 for a given cohort.

Video Submission

Successful Student Musicians from Stage 1 will submit a short video showcasing their passion for music and leadership.

This does not have to be in the form of an audition for Years 5 and 6. Year 7 and 8 students should attempt to showcase their current ability.

Students may want to talk about their dedication to groups, clubs or hobbies to demonstrate their passion. Students are encouraged to be creative with their submissions. All video submissions must be emailed to ima@hazelglencollege.com by Friday 21st November 4pm.

Below are the guidelines:

- Video length no longer than 5 minutes
- May include performance piece
- Video file must be saved as MP4 or MOV
- Video file must be emailed to: ima@hazelglencollege.com

Student Musicians who are successful in Stage 2 of their IMA Application will be notified of shortlisting or requiring an interview for Stage 3 via email sent by ima@hazelglencollege.com. Unsuccessful applicants will be notified via email.



Stage 3 of Application: Musician Interview

Interview

The final step in the application process *may require* an interview for those successful at Stage 2, with the Instrumental Music Academy Leader and Director of Music. This is an event that will be held on **Thursday 27th November from 4-6pm** inside the Hazel Glen Performing Arts Center. This event can only be attended by Student Musicians. Below is a breakdown of the Interview:

- ✓ **Student Passion:** Prospective Student Musicians will need to describe to the interviewers why they wish to be part of the IMA. Students should consider how they can contribute as leaders within the school community, work as part of a team within their IMA class and College Ensemble Program/s, and individual goals for their own musicianship. Students may want to show their current ability on an instrument but this is not required.
- ✓ Question and Answer: Students will have a chance to ask the interviewers questions about the program and talk about what they would be interested in doing in the IMA. Interviewers will have some time to ask Student Musicians any final questions.

SUCCESSFUL + UNSUCCESSFUL LETTERS

Once the Interview has concluded, **25 letters of offer** will be emailed to successful applicants per year level. Positions will be offered after careful consideration of combining Questions and Answer, Student Passion, the IMA Written Application, References, and previous school reports. Both successful and unsuccessful Emails will be sent out via the IMA email. *If unsuccessful, information will be provided regarding the opportunity to join the Instrumental Music Program (IMP) and HGC Ensemble.*

✓ Successful student musicians and families will then be required to complete the Instrumental Music Academy Student Agreement attached to the successful email. This contract must be provided to the IMA Leader at the beginning of the following term.

^{*}Please note that some applicants may not need to attend the interview stage dependent on their Stage 1 and 2 applications.
